James H. O'Hara (10) enlisted in the Confederate Army at New Orleans on 5 July 1861, probably upon returning from Mexico for the purpose of enlisting. He became a sergeant in Company E of the 15th Louisiana Infantry. He was wounded while a sergeant of that Company at the Battle of Cedar Run (Confederate name) 8 August 1862. After a slow recovery, Sgt. O'Hara (10) was detailed to duty in early 1863 in the "Nitre and Mining Bureau" in Richmond Va. On sick leave in June 1863, he was captured by Union troops in St. Louis when he went to visit his folks. He was released on his parole not to take up arms against the Union. He returned to Mexico. He is marked as AWOL in the Confederate archives.

<sup>1</sup> William S. King (12) married twice more after the death of his first wife (13) in childbirth. By his second wife he had one child, Alma King b 6/10/1883.

William King migrated to Oregon over the Oregon Trail in the summer of 1851 in a wagon train with Blewford Stringer family who were neighbors in Peoria Co. Ill. He prospected for gold and fought indians in southern Oregon in the 1850s. There is some record of his being there every year from 1853 to 1860

Catherine Jane Wiley (13) crossed the plains in 1859. A family tradition is to the effect that her brother, John Wiley, was in a cavalry escort for the train during the latter part of this journey. There is some indirect confirmation of this.

18 BENJAMIN FORRER & 19 MARGARET CHAMBERS

Remarks:

The 1850 census for Bath Twp Greene County Ohio states that Benjamin Forrer was a miller, born in Pennsylvania. Family tradition has it that the Forrers were Pennsylvania Dutch.

The 1850 census for Bath Twp Greene County Ohio also shows a John Forry as a near neighbor of Benjamin Forrer (18). John Forry is shown as a miller, age 30, born in Pennsylvania, with a wife Mariah (?), age 22, also born in Pennsylvania, and with a 9 month old son, Jacob, born in Iowa, in which State Benjamin Forrer's third child was born in 1848.

The fact that Benjamin Forrer (18) and John Forry were both born in Pennsylvania, were both millers, both had a child born in Iowa in the late 1840's, indicates that they were relatives, who spelled their names differently if the census taker's spelling was correct.

There are two records of marriages of a David Forrer and Polly Good in Greene County Ohio, one 8/30/1837 and the other 9/9/1837, possibly two ceremonies for the same persons. The relationship, if any, of this David Forrer to Benjamin Forrer (18) is not known.

"History of Shelby County, Ohio", Sutton, 1883, p 298, says Jacob Forrar was born in Berks County Pennsylvania 12/11/1814. He was a tailor. He moved to Greene County Ohio in 1837 where he married Mary Good. In 1838 he and his wife moved to Montgomery County Ohio and in 1841 to Shelby County Ohio.

Berks County Pennsylvania, of which Reading is the principal city, is in the Pennsylvania Dutch area.

Historical Review of Berks County, vol 4, p 105 (in State Library, Columbus Ohio) says:- Early Tulpehocken Settlers - John Forrer (Fuhrer, etc) came to Tulpehocken region after May 13 1723 but prior to Jan 10 1725. Around 1732 he was one of the land owners in the Valley. It is believed that he was the John Fuhrer who was on the 1710 and 1712 Hunters Ration Lists. In the latter year the family consisted of four persons over and one under ten years. The names Forry and Ferry as well as several others seem to have come from his name.

The Tulpehocken River joins the Schukill River in Reading, Berks County, Pennsylvania.

Remarks:

Patience O'H. Thompson (5) recalled that her aunts in St Louis had told her in the 1880's that the Clanceys (or Clancys) were a well to do family whose way of life "before the War" had included trips to Europe. Young "Pashie" (5) was counselled by her aunts:- "Be nice to the Clanceys; they have the money, you know", indicating that some, at least, of the Clancey affluence survived "the War".

This record shows her father's name as McKeever (no first name) and her mother's name as Truecks or Trucks, - writing not legible enough to determine which; no first name given for mother. It is believed by MRT and RET that the death record for Mrs. Cullers incorrectly showed her grandmother's maiden name for her mother's maiden name.

Notes made by Patience O'H. Thompson (5) showed Margaret (Maggie) Cullers' mother's name as Lynch and her grandmother's maiden name as Truax or Truxe.

Remarks:

James McKeever (22) was in the 1878 City Directory for Sherman Texas as a clerk for his son in law Jacob Cullers. He was boarding in the Cullers' house, so his wife was probably dead at that time. Patience O'H. Thompson (5) understood that Mrs. \_\_\_\_\_ (Lynch) McKeever died about age 44, which would make her death about 1870.

The 1899-1900 Sherman City Directory is the last one in which James McKeever (22) appears; he is shown as retired and living with his son in law Jacob Cullers. He probably died shortly after that Directory was compiled, as he does not appear in the 1901-1902 Sherman City Directory.

The 1870 Kansas City census shows the father of Patience McKeever O'Hara (11) as being "foreign born". Patience O'H. Thompson (5) said her grandfather McKeever, whom she saw in Sherman Tex in the early 1890's, had an Irish brogue and she understood that he was born in Ireland. However, in the 1880 census of Sherman Tex, both the father and mother of Margaret (McKeever) Cullers were listed as having born in Ohio. The understanding of Patience O'H. Thompson (5) was that the wife of her grandfather McKeever, whose maiden name was Lynch, had been born in the US.

From the 'parchment' family record compiled about 1924 from discussion with Robert H. King (6), "Catherine Wiley, twin of Emma, crossed plains in year of famine in train of 100 wagons in charge of brother accompanied by 2 troops of cavalry. When the train arrived Brother John S. (Wiley) was sent back by Gov. to rescue some starving people who had been raided by the Indians. Discovered them eating a man who had died. They were unable to walk so tied them back to back on mules to carry them west. Brother John, born about 1824, made several trips across the plains as captain of wagon trains in gov. employ. First trip about 1850." Articles in the Puget Sound Herald, Steilacoom, W.T., 9/16/1859 about "Captain Wallen's Command" give information somewhat agreeing with the 'parchment' story. Catherine's brother could not have been in charge of the train. He was probably in the cavalry escort or patrol for the route. The year of the famine was 1859. John Wiley is not listed in the 1850 census as a member of the family. He may have been a son by a former marriage of David Wiley.

From Capt Wallen's official report 10/1/1859. "I was obliged to encamp nine days at the Owghee (So. Oregon), and send the dragoons back sixty miles to bring up some emigrants who sent forward to inform me that they were out of animals and provisions. . . I supplied these families with animals and food . . . But for our being out on the road these nine men four women and fifteen children, must have perished . . ."

There is a hazy tradition of indian blood in the McMahan family.  
Some children of Alfred McMahan (14) showed characteristics of indians,  
particularly Ida (7), Charles and Roberta. A source of such indian  
blood, if any, could well be Susannah Cox whose picture shows some  
characteristics.

The children of the McMahans (28 x 29), the Monningers (30 x 31)  
and Kings (24x25) lived near and knew each other in Peoria Co in the

Robinson's History of Greene County states that Bath Twp was organized March 3 1807, and shows, in the list of males over 21 there in 1807, Adam Chambers (38) and James Chambers (152). That list does not include any Kirkwoods. This History, page 333, shows Anna Kirkwood as arriving in Bath Twp in 1813.

Broadstone's History of Greene County shows, page 283, Adam Chambers (38) and James Chambers (152) in the first enumeration of voters in Bath Twp in 1808. That list does not include any Kirkwoods.

The 1820 census for Bath Twp, Greene County, Ohio, which was the earliest for that county, shows, on successive lines on page 159, the following:

The Adam Chambers is No. 38 and the Wm Chambers is his brother. Ann Kirkwood probably was the second wife and widow of Robert Kirkwood (78). (Deeds from Robert Kirkwood (78) in 1802 to lands in Rockbridge County, Va, show that his wife at that time was named Sarah). Ann Kirkwood was one of the four persons bonded May 1, 1810 (No. 62 Probate Court) in Montgomery County Ohio to see that the estate of Robert Kirkwood (78) was properly administered. From that it is assumed that she was his widow. The others so bonded were Samuel Grimes, Hugh Andrews, and Jacob Long. Samuel Grimes may have been the father or brother of Ann Kirkwood.

The male age 16-25 with Ann Kirkwood probably was young Robert Kirkwood, son of Robert Kirkwood (78).

We have not identified the other Kirkwoods, though it seems probable that they bore some relationship to Robert Kirkwood (78)

The death record of Margaret (McKeever) Cullers gives her mother's maiden name as "Truecks", or possibly "Trucks" - writing not sufficiently legible to determine which. These are reasonable phonetic spellings of a name orally pronounced Truax or Truxe.

The information for that death record apparently came from Margaret (McKeever) Cullers' young grandnieces, who apparently confused the maiden name of Margaret (McKeever) Cullers' grandmother with that of her mother; interviewed approximately 50 years later, these grandnieces had no recollection of the names of their great grandparents.

The death record confirms the statements of Patience O'H. Thompson (5) that there was a Truax or Truxe (or Truecks or Trucks) in her ancestry, but does not confirm her statement that it was her great grandmother.

The information from Patience O'H Thompson (5) was:

That her great grandmother was Patience Truax or Truxe (47), and that her Truax or Truxe ancestors were a prominent United States family;

That Patience Truax (which spelling will be used hereinafter) had married a Lynch (46), first name not known;

That the wedding had probably had occurred somewhere in the Middle West, possibly Ohio;

That one of the daughters (23) of Patience (Truax) Lynch (47), first name not known, had married a McKeever (22), first name not known, who was grandfather of Patience O'H Thompson (5); that another daughter of Patience (Truax) Lynch (47) was named Patience Lynch and that "Patience was a frequent family name";

That one of the granddaughters of Patience (Truax) Lynch (47) was Margaret E. (McKeever) Cullers, wife of Jacob Cullers, of Sherman and Gainesville Tex, with whom Patience O'H. Thompson (5) had stayed in 1892 and 1893.

Extensive research has not developed any information regarding the ancestry of Patience Truax (47).

But it is possible that Patience Truax (47) was a descendant of Philippe du Trieux, 1586-1653, a Walloon, who emigrated with his second wife from Amsterdam to New Amsterdam (New York) on the ship New Netherland in 1624.

An unpublished manuscript, "The House of Truax", of a little over a hundred pages, by Allen L. Truax about 1945, was loaned to Matthew R. and Ralph E. Thompson. This manuscript, in turn, was based on "The House of Truax", an unpublished manuscript by Theodore de T. Truax, 1903, in the library of New York Genealogical and Biographical Society, and on hundreds of pages of research data by Allen L. Truax now in the archives of the Minnesota Historical Society, St Paul Minn. Apparently Philippe du Trieux was the progenitor of most of the Truaxes in America.

Philippe du Trieux, 1586-1653, was one of the first, if not the first, to build a house on what is now Beaver St, Borough of Manhattan, New York City (heart of the present (1970) financial district). He had six children during his first dozen years in New Amsterdam, one of whom, Sarah, was "the first Christian daughter born in New Amsterdam".

Philippe du Trieux II, oldest son of Philippe du Trieux, baptised at Amsterdam Holland 10 Feb 1619, also emigrated to New Amsterdam, probably with his father and stepmother in 1624. Philippe du Trieux II had two sons born in New Amsterdam:- Isaac, baptised at New Amsterdam 4/21/1642; and Jacob, baptised at New Amsterdam 12/2/1645.

Son Isaac du Trieux, or Truax, was the progenitor of the Schenectady NY branch of the Truax family. Schenectady is in the Mohawk Valley about 15 miles northwest of Albany.

Some of the descendants of Isaac du Trieux or Truax settled in Monmouth County NJ.

The spelling "Truax" began to appear in the third generation and was the usual spelling in the fourth and later generations, though variant spellings "Trueax" and "Truex" appear a number of times after the fourth generation.

The Truaxes were a very prolific family. Though the manuscripts referred to do not purport to cover all descendants of Philippe du Trieux, they do list births in New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Vermont, Canada, Kentucky, Ohio and Michigan of some 230 direct descendants of Philippe du Trieux, with last name Truax or Truex, during the period 1780-1820, which would cover the probable birth date of Patience Truax (47).

The manuscripts do not disclose any "Patience Truax" marrying a Lynch. But with such a large number of direct descendants of Philippe du Trieux listed in areas where Patience Truax (47) might have been, and with an undisclosed number not listed, it seems possible that Patience Truax (47) was one of Philippe du Trieux's descendants.

It is possible that Joseph C King and Ebenezer King were twins. The 1850 census shows them both being 37 years old and b in N.J. They both married Sarah who were both born in Ohio. Joseph's first four children were born in Ohio, last one about 1840. Ebenezer's first three children were born in Ohio, last one about 1839. John C. King had a son born in Ohio in 1833. These three men all had children born in Illinois in the very early 1840s. It is surmised that the entire family spent the 1820 in N.J., the 1830s in Ohio, and thereafter in Illinois. They may have spent a little time in Md about 1820. ROBERT HENRY KING (6) thought they had lived in Maryland for a while.

The 1850 census lists Andrew King as age 66 which would make him born in 1784. This differs with the Raccoon Church birth or baptism date of 1787. The discrepancy can be accounted for in various ways. Or it may be claimed that there are two Andrew Kings born about the same time (1785) and in the same place, Salem Co N.J. However, since Andrew named his first son John, it is assumed that it was after his grandfather. Andrew is a name in the earlier King and Dalbow lines.

Roxkbridge County microfilm reels 48 and 49, at Virginia State Library, show early Rockbridge County marriages. . They do not show a marriage by Robert Kirkwood. They do show, reel 48, a marriage of Charles Seacat to Nancy Kirkwood March 3 1796. It is not known whether Nancy Kirkwood was related to Robert Kirkwood (78). Morton's History of Rockbridge County states, page 497, that a Catherine Kirkwood married a Stanley Seisson in 1796 and that a Nancy Kirkwood married a Charles Seacot in 1796.

The 1790 and 1800 US Censuses of Virginia were destroyed when the British burned Washington DC in the War of 1812. As a substitute for the censuses, Morton's History of Rockbridge County shows, page 373, a list of Rockbridge taxpayers in 1782. No Robert Kirkwood is included in the list. Robert Kirkwood, however, is shown, page 463, as a holder of a Tavern License in Rockbridge in 1801. The 1810 census for Rockbridge County does not show any Kirkwood. According to the probate record, Robert Kirkwood (78) had died in Dayton Ohio in that year.

According to Morton's History of Rockbridge County, "immigration began to flock into the Rockbridge area in the fall of 1737. . . . When Augusta (County) attained a separate county government in 1745, the population of its vast area was about 4,000." They were largely Ulster people of Scotch ancestry. The first county to be set off from Augusta was Betetourt, which became effective January 31 1770. Rockbridge County was authroized by the Assembly in October 1777.

The Portrait and Biographical Album of Greene and Clarke Counties states that Robert Kirkwood (78) was of Scotch-Irish ancestry, that he was a native of Virginia, and that he died in Dayton Ohio.

Broadstone's History of Greene County states, page 285 "During the first decade of the past century" (i.e., 1800-1810) "there came into the township" (i.e., Bath Twp, Greene County) William, Adam and John Chambers, John and Robert Kirkwood . . .".

The 1820 census for Bath Twp, Greene County, which was the earliest for that county, shows, on successive lines on page 159, the following:

The Adam Chambers is No. 38 and the Wm Chambers is his brother. Ann Kirkwood probably was the second wife and widow of Robert Kirkwood(78). (Deeds from Robert Kirkwood (78) in 1802 to lands in Rockbridge County, Va, show that his wife at that time was named Sarah). Ann Kirkwood was one of the two administrators of, and one of the four persons bonded with respect to, the estate of Robert Kirkwood (No. 62, May 1, 1810, Probate Court, Montgomery County, Ohio). From that it is assumed that she was his widow. The other administrator was Samuel Grimes, from which it is assumed that he was some relative. Among the listed assets of the estate was a debt of \$80 owing from a Mary Grimes. That lends some credence to an assumption that Samuel Grimes was somehow related to Robert Kirkwood. He may have been Ann Kirkwood's brother or father, or he may have the father of Robert Kirkwood's first wife, Sarah, and so have been a grandfather of Robert Kirkwood's children.

The male age 16-25 with Ann Kirkwood probably was young Robert Kirkwood, son of Robert Kirkwood (78).

We have not identified the other Kirkwoods, though it seems probable that they bore some relationship to Robert Kirkwood (78), possibly his children.

Quote from Some Data: "Nothing definite is known in regard to the ancestry of John and Magdalena Moninger, who were no doubt born in Germany about the year 1753. The statement is made by one authority that the parents did not emigrate from Germany until after the birth of their eight children. Other data which looks more credible would indicate the parents were located in Funkstown, Md., in 1789 which date is prior to that of the birth of at least two of the children. The earliest definite location of the family now known is the year 1800 when they crossed the Allegheny Mt westward into Washington County, Pennsylvania"

The 1783 deed noted above clearly indicates that John Moninger Sr. (120) was indeed in Funkstown, Md., before 1789.

No birth dates were given for the children in Some Data. We know that John Jr. (60) was born ca 1778 because he was 59 when he died in 1837. Mary (m by 1800) was probably born ca 1780. If the other children (except John) were listed in the order of their births and two of them were born after 1789, their approximate birth dates would be: Catherine 1781, Madaline 1783, George 1785, Henry 1787, Jacob 1789, Elizabeth 1791. This is purely speculation.There is a possibility that JOHN MONINGER, SR. (120) came to America as a 'Hessian' mercenary for the English in the Revolution. Statement by VIRGINIA MONNINGER (15) recorded about 1925, "Family is supposed to (have) come from Alsace-Lorraine, Dutch and French thru Maryland. English speaking people migrated to Pennsylvania and Maryland."

## Remarks:

Bell (source below) says: "William Hardy, the subject of this genealogy, may have been the 26 year old clerk of 1660, the immigrant of 1669, 1678, or a native born Marylander. However, the clerk of 1660 appears to belong to a prior generation. And, since the immigrant of 1678 was accompanied to Maryland by his wife, Susanna, while the testator of a will dated 4 January 1717 mentioned his wife, Elizabeth, as well as his children (none of whom was named Susanna), it seems more likely that the testator was the immigrant of 1669 and the William Hardy of this sketch. Never-the-less, the testator of the above will, whether he was the clerk of 1660, the immigrant of 1669, 1678 or Maryland born, was a resident of Charles' County Maryland, 13 January 1708 when, the court minutes of that date indicate, he presented a 'man servant to the court to be adjudged for runaway time'. And he was established on a hundred acre tract of land within Boarman's Manor between a stream known as Zekiah Swamp and Dividing Run and near the present village of Bryantown, Charles' County, Maryland (about 25 miles south of Washington DC) when he dictated his last will and testament 4 January 1717. This will was probated 12 August 1717"

The birthdates of Rachel and Susannah are incompatible. Perhaps Rachel was born in 1737. PMHB states that Jonas Keen had at least 8 children born in Salem County and then lists the above except for Rachel. In a footnote (p.337) it states that "Charles Dahlbo . . . b 4/6/1723 (Raccoon Church Register) married 8/12/1756 Rachel, daughter of Jonas Keen, of Gloucester County, b 9/14/1736 . . .) The Raccoon Swedish Church was close to the boundary between Salem and Gloucester Counties and was the church of the Keens and the Dalbos. As a young man Jonas Keen lived in Salem County but perhaps at the time of the marriage of Rachel to Charles Dalbo, he lived across Oldman's Creek in Gloucester Co. There seem to be no other Jonas Keens in the area hence Rachel must be the daughter of this one Jonas. Other factors (wills) support this view.

"Joran Kyn, one of the earliest European residents upon the river Delaware, and for more than a quarter of a century the chief proprietor of land a Upland, New Sweden, afterwards Chester, Pa, was born in Sweden about A.D.1620. He came to America in company with Governor John Printz in the ship FAMA, which 'sailed from Stockholm,' narrates Magister John Campanius Holm, a fellow-passenger in the same vessel, 'on the 16th of August, 1642,' and, after stopping at Dahlehamn, Copenhagen, and Helsingor, left Gottenburg Castle for the 'Spanish Sea on the 1st of November, at noon.'" (After many hardships) "...but on the 15th of February 1643, by God's grace, came up to Fort Christina, in New Sweden, Va. at two o'clock in the afternoon.' Here the first three Swedish expeditions had established their chief settlement under Minuit and Hollender." (Fort Christina is now Wilmington, Delaware.) "...Here resided Joran Kyr In a 'Rulla' dated at 'Kihrstina, June 20, 1644...he is mentioned (under his appellation of SNOHUIT |translate Snow-white| as a soldier in the Governor's life-guard, and in a 'list of Persons living in New Sweden, March 1, 1648,' he is once more similarly described." Soon after 1648 Joran Keen moved to Upland (Pa.). He was very active in social and political affairs of the communities where he lived. "...He was married but his wife's name has not come down to us...."

Clerkenwell (London Postal District E.C.1. for "East City 1") is that part of London on the northern edge of the Central City area where newspapers ("Fleet Street") and major banks ("Threadneedle Street") are located. There is still (1971) a St. James Church there; the present structure dates back to 1792, with several subsequent alterations and additions.

The first Parish record of our Thompsons was the marriage of Richard Thomson (4096) and Florance Cromlan (4097) there 25 June 1579.

At that time, Clerkenwell apparently was changing from what had been a rural suburb of London into a built up, apparently affluent suburb.

As far as can be judged from the records, neither the Thomson family nor the Cromlan family was local to the area, and apparently our Thomson family did not remain in Clerkenwell after the death of Richard Thomson (4096) in 1603.

No record found in St Andrews Parish Registers of any baptisms.

Note A: Agnes Bryant is shown in Amy and Thompson as the mother of Amyes Colle. We believe that that is improbable and almost impossible. The birth of an Amyes Colle, by any variant of that spelling, is not shown in the printed Parish Registers for St Andrews, Plymouth, which start with 1581. The only time a child not shown in the Parish Registers could have been born to William Colle and Agnes (Bryante) Colle (4098 & 4099) would be about October, 1596. If Amyes Colle (2049) had been born at that time to William and Agnes (Bryante) Colle, Amyes would have been less than 17 years old when she married David Thomson (2048).

That Amyes (Colle) Thomson was the daughter of William Colle is attested by the marriage settlement by William Colle on his son in law David Thomson 1 April 1615, reported in Noyes, p 680.

Note B: Frank W. Hackett, in NEHGR v 47 p 78, says: "You need have no doubt as to the identity. He was evidently not a Plymouth man. Quite as clearly she was a Plymouth woman for though I could not find the entry of her birth (in the St Andrews Parish Registers), the Colles or Coles were a Plymouth family; and about the time when she must have been born there were four Coles having children baptized year by year - Thomas, Vincent, William, and Robert . . .".

However, we believe that William Colle was not originally a Plymouth man, or at least, not a St Andrews man. There is no reference to him, so far as we could find, in the printed St Andrews Parish Registers beginning with 1581, prior to his marriage to Agnes Bryante in 1595. And about the same time that William Colle (Cole) appeared in the St Andrews Parish Registers, several other Colles (Coles) appeared, which we believe indicates they were from somewhere other than St Andrews. We believe those others were possibly brothers and sister of William Colle (4098). See Detail Sheet 8196 x 8197.

No record found in St Andrews Parish Registers of any  
children by this marriage, nor other evidence found that

Note: Agnes Bryant is shown in Amy and Thompson as the  
mother of Amyes Colle. In the first printing of this  
genealogy, we believed that that was improbable and almost  
impossible. Neither the printed nor original St Andrews  
Parish Registers, which start with 1581, shows the baptism  
of an Amyes Colle or Cole. For that reason, we rejected the  
assumption that the Amyes Colle (Cole) who married David  
Thomson was the daughter of William Colle (4098) by his  
wife, Agnes Bryant.

We have now reversed our former opinion. We now believe  
that evidence uncovered since the first printing of this  
genealogy indicates quite conclusively that "Empes Cole",  
daughter of William and Agnes (Bryant) Cole was the Amyes  
Colle (2049) who married David Thomson (2048).

4098 WILLIAM COLLE & 4099 AGNES BRYANT

The will of William Bryant (with 8198 x 8199) dated 27 February 1602 (present calendar) leaves "to Agnes (or Amyes) Cole one silver spoon", and leaves to a sister 40 shillings a year "yssue out of one Cole house". The will appoints William Cole as one of the "Rulers" of the estate, and William Cole is one of the witnesses. That is persuasive evidence that Amyes Colle (2049) was related to William Bryant, and almost certainly was the same person as "Empes Cole", the daughter of William and Agnes (Bryant) Cole (Colle), and was the then four year old granddaughter of William Bryant.

The spelling, "Empes", in the baptismal record is not as persuasive evidence as we once thought that Amyes was not the daughter of William and Agnes (Bryant) Cole. We have found a number of different spellings of the given name of the known Amyes (Colle) (Thomson) Maverick, as appears below.

Certain documents owned by Mrs. T. Passy of Cornwood, Devon, England, which were temporarily in the Archives Department of the City of Plymouth Public Libraries at the time of our visit, included a Bond to which William Cole was a witness by his mark 27 August 1621, and the accompanying Quit Claim to which William Cole was a witness by his mark 27 September 1621. That indicates that William Cole could not write, so that any recording of the given name of Amyes which came from William Cole would have been the scribe's interpretation of the pronunciation by William Cole.

Further linking William Cole to the Bryants, and showing beyond reasonable doubt that Amyes (Colle) (Thomson) Maverick (2049) was the daughter of William Colle (Cole) (4098) are:

1. "Marriage Settlement" (copy attached) of William Cole on his son in law David Thomson in which William Cole leased to "David Thomson & Ems his wife" "the daughter of the said Wm" portions of the dwelling built by William Cole on "the lands of the heires of Bryant".

2. Additional documents in connection with the foregoing property which Amyes recorded in Boston on 26 March 1648.

3. A letter (copy attached) dated 26 November 1635, regarding the foregoing property, which Amias Maverick (2049) wrote to her friend Robert Trelawny in Plymouth, England.

RET comment:

The harsh tone of this "settlement" is not necessarily indicative of the character of William Cole (Colle). William Cole apparently was illiterate. That was evidenced by two documents I saw at the Archives of the Plymouth (England) Public Libraries which had been witnessed by William Cole in 1621 by his mark. (The documents were part of a collection owned by Mrs. T. Passy of Cornwood, Devon, temporarily on loan to the Archives).

Therefore, the settlement was probably written by a law clerk who wanted to show off his command of legal terminology by incorporating all of it he could in the document.

Actually, the terms of the lease to David and Amyes Thomson were quite generous. They were leased one kitchen, one shop, one Courtlage, one hall, and two chambers, for 60 years, for an annual rent of 10 shillings, <sup>per annum</sup> equal to only one-fourth of the ground rent for the land on which William Cole had built the building. (See will of William Bryant, 8198)

The date of the settlement (April 1, 1615) does not necessarily indicate the date that the Thomsons first started living with the Coles, - the Thomsons had been married for one and three quarters years at the time. But Amyes was then pregnant with her first child, Anne, and perhaps both the Coles and Thomsons wanted there to be some formal document evidencing right of possession for what was soon expected to be a family. The quarters granted David and Amyes were very impressive for a young married couple.

The fact that David Thomson and his family were living in a building also occupied by his in-laws makes understandable how it was possible for David and Amyes to leave six and one half year old Prissilla behind when they went to America; Prissilla was living with her grandfather and step-grandmother.

The letter of Amias (Colle)(Thomson) Maverick to Trelawny in 1635, and the filing of the settlement and related papers with the Recorder of Suffolk County, Mass, in 1644, indicate that there was some falling-out between Amyes and her father over title to the property. We have not been able to find out anything about the outcome; public recording of title papers to real estate was quite rare at the time.

RET notes:

Note 1: David Thomson, or some of his crew, knew enough about construction to erect some sizeable structures. At Pannaway, he and his crew "built a Strong and Large House, enclosed it with a large and high Palizado and mounted Gunns", in addition to smaller buildings, such as a blacksmith shop, a carpenter shop, a salt works, one or more stages for landing and preparing the fish catch for shipment, fish drying racks, 144 c6

and perhaps other structures.

When Thomson's friend, Samuel Maverick, decided in 1625 to set up his own plantation at "Winnisimmet" (at what is now the Chelsea section of Boston), Thomson and his crew helped in the erection of a house "fortified with a Pallizado and fflankers and gunnes both below and above in them".

In 1626, Thomson and his men set up Thomson's second establishment, at Thompson's Island in Boston Harbor.

Part of this knowledge of construction on Thomson's part may have come from his association with his shipwright father in law, William Cole (Colle). The activities at Pannaway, and the 1626 establishment on an island, indicate that there must have been boats at Pannaway and at Thompson's Island, but we found no record of where such boats came from. It may be fair to assume that they were built by Thomson's men, perhaps utilizing knowledge Thomson had gained from his father in law.

Evidencing that William Cole probably had knowledge of construction other than ships, is a record of a payment to him in 1617 for "iii Irishe beames" for use in construction of the Plymouth (England) Hospital of Orphans' Aid.

Note 2: At the time, the Apothecary was the practical physician of the people. Seven years apprenticeship training was required to become an apothecary. During that time, the apprentice, under the guidance of his master, learned by actually participating in the treatment of ill persons, and participating in the only activity of the time that could be likened to "medical research"; learning, by observing and doing, that different illnesses had different characteristics, and what the effects of the various treatments were.

In contrast, the training of physicians included no contact with the ill, and no research; it was purely academic theory. Upon being licensed, many physicians were more interested in association with the gentry than in the treatment of the common people. It was customary for physicians to leave the City with the Court or gentry during the periodic plague epidemics, largely leaving it to apothecaries to do what they could for the victims. It may be that the death of eleven year old David Thomson's father in the plague of 1603 influenced David to become an apothecary.

The sincere physician, however, was faced with a dilemma; he could apply his theory with no experience regarding probable result, or could turn to the apothecary, whom physicians considered far below them socially, for cooperation and experience. Eventually, the training of physicians incorporated actual experience with the ill, and research, which had been characteristic of the apothecary's training.

At the time, surgeons were a separate craft that ranked far below the apothecaries.

Note 3: There were several conduits in Plymouth at the time. It is not known which of the conduits is referred to here.

Note 4: The fact that Amyes was, prior to January 1626 (present calendar), able to make remittances of fifty pounds and thirty pounds to her father indicates that David Thomson was prospering at Pannaway.

Note 5: Presumably this businesslike document (executed in January 1625/6) was prepared by or for David Thomson (2048) for carriage, with the 80 pounds, to Plymouth (England) by an agent of Thomson for execution by William Cole (4098), and return to Pannaway. Perhaps the document also indicates a businesslike mind on the part of Amyes (2049)

From the date of the execution, the money and document were probably sent to Plymouth in the fall of 1625, when the ships returned to the mother country with their cured fish and furs, and the executed document brought back to Pannaway in March 1626 (present calendar) at the start of the 1626 fishing season.

The 50 pounds transmitted bought out the ground rent of 2 pounds a year for the land of the heirs of Bryant (8198) on which Cole (4098) had erected his dwelling, part of which had been leased to David and Amyes Thomson (2048 x 2049). This was probably considered to be a prudent investment for the protection of the futures of Thomson's wife and children.

The 30 pounds for which Cole was to make an accounting to Thomson probably was for an investment of some kind that Cole was to make in Plymouth in connection with Thomson's Pannaway plantation.

Nottells Island in Massachusetts Bay  
the 20th of November, 1635

Good Sir:-

I kindly salute you in the Lord. I am given to understand by divers that my ffather is verie much incensed against me, but by what meanes I know not, and that he hath offered to make sale of his land, notwithstanding he conveyed it to me by his deed (which I doubt not but will prove sufficient), and had of me fifty pounds in consideration of it, that so the land might remaine to me & my children after my ffathers decease. (RET note 1). And now I am enformed that my ffather would fayne dispose of the land & repay this £50. Now my humble request unto your worship is, that as you loved my first husband, so you would be pleased to doe that favor for me and my ffatherless children as to speake to my father concerning this thing, for I am perswaded your good word to him in our behalfe will much prevaile, and whereas my father (as I am told) would dispose of the land and have mee to take the £50 againe, I shall desire you to intreate him that it may remaine with him, for my children, & that he would not goe about to putt the land from us contrary to his deeds & promises. As for the house which I lived in, my father gave it me presently in marriage, and I have left it wholly to his disposing since I came thence, without haveing any benefitt of it, only to give my father content. And thus craveing pardon for my greate boldnes, not doubting but that you wilbe pleased to doe me this favour, wherein both I and mine shall ever rest obliged unto you, and thus with my best respects to your selfe & your loveing wife, I humbly take my leave, and remaine, your ffriend.

This Sheet is very speculative. Its only basis is that Thomas and Mary Colle "of Compton" (an area of Plymouth), and John, Thomas, Vincent, Elizabeth, Robert, and William Colle first appeared in the St Andrews Parish Registers at about the same time. All references to Colle, by several variant spellings, in the St Andrews Parish Registers were copied, from the beginning of the Registers in 1581 through 1633. The pattern of those references indicated that possibly there was such a family as the one shown on this Sheet. On the basis of that flimsy evidence, this Sheet shows Thomas and Mary Colle as the parents of the children listed.

W. H. Savage notes:

Note 1: The value of money - At this date (1601) a skilled workman would get 6d a day, i. e., 3s a week, i. e., less than £8 a year., and this would be enough to support him and his family. So a legacy of £2 or £3 a year would be well worth having.

Note 2: "performed" is an odd word to use here. It could be an English version of the French "performier", and intended to mean something like "used to furnish". No other reading than "performed" seems possible.

Note 3: The clerk writes "It &" presumably to avoid writing "Item I give and bequeathe" in full.

Note 4: The surname is difficult to read - "e" could be "o" and "n" is always a difficult letter. LENDEN is my preferred reading. The name is still to be found in Plymouth - so is LONDON.

Note 5: This sentence is obscure. I think the clerk must have omitted some words when copying the original.

Note 6: "Porcons" - the writer regularly writes "cion" where we would use "tion". An "i" seems to have dropped out because he was writing at speed.

Note 7: "mannie" is another odd word. It reminds me of the French word "manier" meaning "to handle" or "to manage". That is obviously what is meant. I think I have met the word before. It is strange to find two expressions reminiscent of French. I wonder if the Bryants came originally from France - perhaps Brittany - the name Bryant is Breton.

RET notes

Note 1: The fact that "fortye shillings yearlye . . . yssuing out of one Cole house" was to be paid Jane "durenge her naturall lyfe" and thereafter to Jane's children shows that a long term "lease" to Cole was involved. The Colle-Thomson "Marriage Settlement" (1615) states that Cole had erected a dwelling on "lands of the heires of Bryant". These two bits of evidence indicate that the "lease" to Cole was a long term "ground rent" for the erection thereon of a building - a procedure that provided the grantor with a long term annuity.

Forty shillings (2 pounds) a year was about one fourth of the annual earnings of a skilled workman, according to WHS note 1. That indicates that Cole must have been reasonably well to do to afford so much rent for the ground on which he erected his dwelling. The description of the space in that dwelling leased to David and Amyes Thomson (2048 x 2049), set forth in the Colle-Thomson "Marriage Settlement", indicates that the dwelling which Cole had erected on the Bryant ground rent, must have been a fairly large one, also indicating that Cole was reasonably well to do.

Note 2; "Agnes" Cole - This was transcribed as "Amyes" Cole in an abstract from the Archivist of the Plymouth Public Libraries.

W. H. Savage comments

The will copy was probably made by a lawyer's clerk who wrote a good "Secretary" hand of the time, but wrote quickly and fluently so that at times similar letters are difficult, such as whether an "s" is intended to be the end of a word. Usually the context solves the problem. The spelling varies, probably because sometimes he copies the original spelling

and sometimes uses the spelling he himself prefers.

Why was the will copied into Sergeant Hele's Precedent Book? Possibly because what William Bryant intended to be done after his death is not expressed clearly enough and could be called into question. The will may have been the subject of a court case.

I have paragraphed the will to make it easier to read - the original copy is without paragraphs. The original copy shows the witnesses but not any signature of William Bryant, or any indication of proving the will.

Sir Robert was eminent in the field of law, as was his grandfather, Sir Roger (33216). He was of the Society of Lincoln's Inn in the early part of the reign of King Henry VIII, 1509-1547.

With his father, Sir Roger ((16608), he attended, January 2, 1539, the Duke of Norfolk in the marriage of King Henry VIII to Lady Anne, daughter of John, Duke of Cleves.

He was made King's Sergeant-at-law in 1541, and was knighted by King Henry VIII at Hampton Court on Trinity Sunday 1545.

He was made Lord Chief Justice in 1545.

He died 2/8/1555-6 possessed of the manor and rectory of Twyford and Gayst, and the manors of Swanton, Foxley and Southwell, in Norfolk (all near Norwich, NNE of London), and the priory and house of St Augustine in Ludlow, Salop.

He was buried in the high chancel of Ludlow Church in an altar tomb. On top of the tomb is a full length marble figure of him dressed in full armor and of his Lady in the costume of her day. There are figures of children surrounding the base of the tomb.
